## Interdisciplinary Management of Congenitally Missing Teeth in the Esthetic Zone

## Abstract:

The crucial question in comprehensive treatment planning for patients affected by tooth agenesis in the so-called esthetic zone is whether to close or to open the space/s by orthodontic means. The evidence-based literature on the topic has proven that space closure offers certain advantages over space opening – especially long-term periodontal maintainability and adaptation to the lifelong changes of the dentofacial complex of a purely natural dentition.

However, several clinical situations do not allow for space closure, if occlusal relationships and functional aspects are considered as equally important as an overall esthetic enhancement. Patients with multiple agenesis or certain dentoskeletal malocclusions will require space opening with subsequent prosthodontic replacement of the missing teeth. An array of clinical patients will be presented to illustrate under which circumstances space closure is indicated and when opening in the upper AND in the lower esthetic zone is indispensable for achieving a sustainable treatment outcome.
